Education support for children under treatment is non-existent at most schools

Non Medical Support for families and children going through life limiting illness is just being discussed at policy level


Families of lower economic strata are most affected

WHO stats: as of 2021, approximately 400,000 children from 0-19 years of age develop cancer each year in low income countries including India

India is now implementing the National Programme for Prevention and Control of Non-Communicable Diseases (NP-NCD) — however, a specific national policy addressing childhood cancer still does not exist.



The Triangle of Care



Mission and Belief: Knowledge empowers and Happiness heals!

- We provide at the hospital wards
 - Educational support provided by trained teachers and volunteers
 - Spiritual support through yoga and creative visualisation
 - Creative play and activity
- **Focus group:** children between 4 and 16 years and women from compromised socioeconomic sections of society in India affected by cancer
- Scholarship for survivors: Post-treatment, help the child return to school in the right grade with confidence and dignity, and support their higher education financially
- Motivation: Childhood cancer treatment has a high success rate: 54 to 76% (source: oncologists)
 - 2016 stats show 63% of all pediatric patient survivorship



Timeline and Milestones

2008	Founded by Ar. Sandhya Sharad in Bengaluru, India
2009	Non-profit trust registered with 2 trustees First learning centre at the Kapur Ward, Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology, Bengaluru Dr. Manjari Bhatnagar joins as Director and Ms. Vidyavathi as the first teacher
2017	Original 2 trustees retire, 2 new trustees on board
2019	Set up and started 1 new learning centre at Mazumdar Shaw Cancer Center, Narayana Health City Bengaluru
2020	Covid support and Pivoted to Samiksha 2.0 - hybrid learning model, launched Samiksha USky digital learning platform (<u>samiksha.usky.in</u>) for children to access at any time, from centres or mobile devices and tablets
2022	Opened 3 new learning centres at IGICH,SSCHRC and LHCC in Bengaluru
2024	Ready to reopen the first learning centre at Kidwai Memorial Institute of Oncology Launched the 6th SFLC at St. John's hospital on 25th January, 2024 Now supporting Nephrology and Thalassemia children at all wards
